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MARRIAGE GUIDELINES

My desire is that that your marriage be all that God intended it to be and that it be the most meaningful relationship possible. In God's creating man and woman He intended that they be joined in marriage to bring God highest honor and glory through their lives together. Since God designed the marriage relationship, it is clear He knows how to build a healthy marriage. As we read His Word, there are basic principles which must be understood and applied if a couple hopes to experience joy and fulfillment in their marriage. Ignoring these principles will result in a breakdown and possible failure of the marriage relationship.

Because I am committed to building strong Christian marriages, here are important up-front guidelines:

1. Participation in Marriage Preparation Training or its equivalency is required for couples who desire to be married. Usually, a minimum of six months of premarital preparation before the wedding date is required.
2. Couples having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord must also share a commitment to establishing a marriage centered unreservedly on Jesus Christ and God's design for their marriage.
3. Couples must remain sexually pure and not live together at any time prior to the wedding ceremony.
4. The blessing of the parents on the marriage is important, first of all because children are instructed by God to "*Honor your father and mother,*" and secondly, because of the promise God gives to the couple "*That it may go well with you*" (Ephesians 6:2-3). This is especially important for younger couples seeking to be married.
5. If your spouse has died, you are clearly Biblically free to remarry (Romans 7:2-3, I Corinthians 7:39).

If seeking remarriage after a divorce

Both divorce and remarriage are complicated. Among all human relationships, marriage is most unique. Only marriage is set apart by God to signify to the world the relationship between Jesus and the church, the very bride of Christ (Eph. 5:21-33). In light of this, the divorcing (breaking) of this bond is extraordinary among all human bonds. The elders of our local church recognize that there are many complicated factors and variables in each marriage and we will prayerfully and Biblically seek wisdom as we discern each case on its own merits in light of the clear direction of Scripture. Those who have been divorced must prayerfully consider remarriage in light of these Biblical teachings:

- divorce occurring because of sexual immorality by your former spouse (Matthew 5:32; 19:3-12)
- a believer seeking remarriage has been abandoned by an unbelieving spouse (I Corinthians 7:15-16)
- the former spouse initiated divorce and has since remarried (Mark 10:1-12; Luke 16:18; Romans 7:1-3)
- divorce occurring before becoming born again as a Christian (II Corinthians 5:17)

If seeking remarriage, please study the passages above and view your situation in light of the Bible. I also strongly recommend getting a copy of the short book, Divorce and Remarriage by Tony Evans (2012, Moody Publishers) and reading through it prayerfully. If, after studying these passages, you still seek remarriage, please call for an appointment with the Pastor to discuss before completing anything further in this packet.
